

State and Poll Champion Teams

1988 – Kalida – Poll & State Champs

In 1988, Kalida finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won both the Poll and State Championship. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Kalida won the State Tournament by defeating Southeastern 62-51 and Zanesville Rosecrans 52-46 respectively. Annette Trenkamp, 1st Team All-PCL and Mary Peck, 1st Team All-PCL led Kalida, coached by Frank Schroeder, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 27-0 record. This was the 1st team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Kalida's 1st State and 1st Poll Championship.

1989 – Kalida – Poll & State Champs

In 1989, Kalida finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won both the Poll and State Championship. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Kalida won the State Tournament by defeating Southeastern 52-41 and Berlin Highland 67-45 respectively. Annette Trenkamp, 1st Team All-PCL and Player of the Year, Sondra Ehrnsberger, 1st Team All-PCL and Leslie Stechschulte, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Kalida, coached by Frank Schroeder, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 27-0 record. This was the 2nd team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Kalida's 2nd consecutive State and Poll Championship.

1993 – Ottoville – State Qualifier

In 1993, Ottoville finished the regular season with a 15-5 record. The Big Green qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Ottoville lost the first game at State to Upper Scioto Valley 74-51. Tracy Wenzlick, 1st Team All-PCL, Karla Wenzlick, 2nd Team All-PCL and Amy Hilvers, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, to a 20-6 record. This was the 3rd team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottoville's 1st.

1996 – Ottoville – State Qualifier

In 1996, Ottoville finished the regular season with a 19-1 record. The Big Green qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Ottoville lost the

first game at State to Southeastern 52-49. Karla Wenzlick, 1st Team All-PCL and Player of the Year, Jaime Knippen, 2nd Team All-PCL and Kris Youngpeter, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 24-2 record. This was the 4th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottoville's 2nd.

1997 – Kalida – State Champs

In 1997, Kalida finished the regular season with a 19-1 record. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Kalida won the State Tournament by defeating New Riegel 48-45 and Ft. Loramie 42-38 respectively. Francine Miller, 1st Team All-PCL and Player of the Year and Kerri Unverferth, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Kalida, coached by Deb Lammers, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 26-1 record. This was the 5th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Kalida's 3rd State Championship.

1998 - Kalida - Poll Champs

In 1998 Kalida finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Wildcats lost to Hopewell-Loudon in the Regional Semi-Finals 61-52. Francine Miller, 1st Team All-PCL and Player of the Year, Heather Haselman, 1st Team All-PCL and Kerri Unverferth, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Kalida, coached by Deb Lammers, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 24-1 record.

2004 – Miller City – State Qualifier

In 2004, Miller City finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Wildcats qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Miller City lost the first game at State to Mansfield St. Peter 54-45. Brooke Hermiller, 1st Team All-PCL and Player of the Year, Megan Niese, 1st Team All-PCL and Lynn Schroeder, 1st Team All-PCL, led Miller City, coached by Chris Rump, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 25-1 record. This was the 6th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Miller City's 1st.

2005 – Ottoville – State Runner-Up

In 2005, Ottoville finished the regular season with a 17-3 record. The Big Green qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Ottoville won the first game at State

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by defeating Xenia Christian 48-41 and lost the State Championship game to Berlin Hiland 55-47. Stacey Wannemacher, 1st Team All-PCL, Megan Kleman, 1st Team All-PCL and Amy Honigford, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, to a 23-4 record. This was the 7th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Ottoville's 3rd.

2005 – O. Glandorf – Poll Champs

In 2005 finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Titans lost to Akron Hoban in the Regional Semi-Finals 44-31. Shelly Bellman was Ottawa-Glandorf's outstanding player. She was 1st Team All-WBL, District II and All-Ohio. Shelly was the Player of the Year in the WBL and District II. She was also a participant in the North/South and District All-Star Game. Bellman and Lynn Sunderhaus, a 1st Team All-WBL player, led OG, coached by Lori Smith, WBL Coach of the Year, to a 24-1 record.

2007 – Ottoville – State Qualifier

In 2007, Ottoville finished the regular season with a 16-4 record. The Big Green qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Ottoville lost the first game at State to Africentric 42-39. Courtney Schimmoeller, 1st Team All-PCL, Eric Vorst, 1st Team All-PCL and Gina Beining, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, to a 21-5 record. This was the 8th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottoville's 4th.

2010 - Ottoville - Poll Champs

In 2010 Ottoville finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Big Green lost to Fort Loramie in the Regional Semi-Finals 48-30. Tasha Kaufman, 1st Team All-PCL and Abby Siefker, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 23-1 record.

2012 - Ottoville – Poll Champs

In 2012 Ottoville finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Big Green lost to Arlington in the Regional Semi-Finals, 59-48. Abby Siefker, 1st Team All-PCL, Player of the Year and Lauren Kramer, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 23-1 record.

2013 – Ottoville – Poll Champ & State Q.

In 2013, Ottoville finished the regular season with a 20-0 record and won the Poll Championship. The Big Green qualified for State by winning six games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. Ottoville lost the first game at State to Fort Loramie 49-42. Abby Siefker was 1st Team All-PCL, PCL Player of the Year and Ohio's Division IV Player of the Year. Siefker along with Rachel Beining, 1st Team All-PCL and Nicole Vorst, 2nd Team All-PCL, led Ottoville, coached by Dave Kleman, PCL Coach of the Year, to a 27-1 record and its second consecutive undefeated regular season. This was the 9th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottoville's 5th.

2015 – O. Glandorf – State Runner-Up

In 2015, Ottawa-Glandorf finished the regular season with a 20-2 record. The Titans qualified for State by winning five games at the Sectional, District and Regional level of tournament play. O-G won the first game at State by defeating Fairland 55-27. The Titans lost the State Championship game to Versailles 49-46. Elissa Ellerbrock, 1st Team WBL and 1st Team All-Ohio, Kylie White, 2nd Team WBL and Dani Ellerbrock, 3rd Team WBL, led O-G, coached by Troy Yant, to a 26-3 record. This was the 10th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottawa-Glandorf's 1st.

This was the 18th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and Ottawa-Glandorf's 6th.

Columbus Grove won the State Tournament by defeating Minster 43-40 and Rootstown 65-46 respectively. This was the 19th team to qualify for State from Putnam County and it was Columbus Grove's 1st State Championship.
