The baseball throwing event ran from 1920-1928 at the PCL Track and Field Meet. The first thrower and record was held by Galen Watterson of Continental when he threw the baseball 271 feet, 8.0 inches. Leonard Chamberlin of Ottawa set the record in 1928 with a throw of 324 feet, 2.0 inches and it was retired in 1928.

This event only ran for three years from 1935-1937. The only recorded jump was in 1937 when Eugene Place of Leipsic made a leap of 39 feet, 8.5 inches. Thus, the hop, step and jump event was retired in 1937.

The javelin throw event only ran from 1925-1929 at the PCL Track and Field Meet. The first thrower and record was held by Oscar Robinson of Leipsic when he threw the javelin 121 feet, 5.0 inches. Robinson reset the record in 1926 when he threw it 145 feet, 0 inches and the event was retired in 1929.
